Emergency Alert Day

On your mobile phone you should receive a text at **3pm on 23rd April** and you will hear a loud siren-like sound for up to 10 seconds as part of UK-wide test of a new emergency alert system that was recently launched by the UK Government.



You will need to click the OK button when it is **safe** to do so.

The system will give the government and emergency services the capability to send an alert directly to mobile phones when there is a risk to life. If you have concerns about this, more information can be found at:

Sparsholt 100 Club

Report on the Accounts for the year ending 31 December 2022

Thanks to the generosity of our members, the 100 Club has now raised over £30,000.

In financial year ending 31 December 2022 the 100 Club raised £7,290 from subscriptions and at year end we had 60 members each contributing £10 per month. Total prize money for the year, awarded at the quarterly draws, amounted to £1,300.

In 2022 the 100 Club distributed £6,000 with grants of £3,000 to Sparsholt Parochial Church Council (PCC) and £3,000 to Friends of St. Stephen's Church (FoSS), the charity set up in 1998 to care for the fabric of our village church. Since the launch of the 100 Club in 2017 the total amount donated to the two beneficiaries is £11,000 each.

As of 31 December 2022, the net financial assets of the 100 Club amounted to £8,245. At its recent meeting the 100 Club Committee decided to make further grants of £4,000 to the PCC and £4,000 to FoSS. This brings the overall amount distributed to a magnificent £30,000 which all our members can be very proud of.

The Parochial Church Council

The Parochial Church Council (the PCC) is a charity responsible for the care and maintenance of St. Stephen's Church, its contents, the churchyard and the finances of the parish. It also aims to promote the mission of God in its parish. It has a voice in the forms of Service used by the church and may make representations to the bishop on matters that affect the welfare of the parish.

Need for more PCC members and Secretary

The PCC is desperately short of members and the numbers are dwindling to a state where **we may no longer be able to keep the Church open nor hold Church Services**, including weddings, baptisms and funerals.

There are only 4 PCC meetings a year, plus the Annual Parochial Church Meeting. We currently have no Secretary, so the Treasurer has to be the Secretary as well; this is an unsustainable situation. We need three or four people to join our numbers on the PCC, one willing to be the Secretary which involves taking the minutes at the meetings. The Annual Parish Meeting on April 22nd at 10:00 will have a climate change theme to start off the event, with speakers promoting biodiversity at Ham Green, recycling within the village and climate change ideas to help households.

Two New Parish Councillors

After many months with two vacancies, The Parish Council was pleased to co-opt two parishioners as new Parish Councillors during the Parish Council Meeting in March.

Mark Himbury moved into Westley Lane in Mid '21 from Bentley in North East Hampshire. It had been his aim to move back to the Winchester area for a long time and Sparsholt became the obvious destination. Mark and his Whippets love the space and views the area has to offer.

He is currently working mostly from home, locating and fitting out offices for a large communications company, having previously designed and developed care homes for all ages as well as several schools.

Since moving here Mark has been impressed with how the community pulls together and how valued the village assets are. He is pleased to join the Parish Council so he can help Sparsholt move forward while retaining its unique character.

Jonathan Walthoe has lived in Winchester since 2017 and in Home Lane, Sparsholt since 2021.

When not commuting to Canary Wharf Jon spends time out and about with his family.

He hopes to use his time on the Parish Council to contribute to its work protecting and enhancing the environment for the benefit of residents and visitors.

Discussions with volunteers are taking place with a view to holding a Climate Café event in the Memorial Hall in May

Dog Fouling

There has been a significant increase in the incidence of dog fouling and abandoned poo bags littering the village footpaths.

The Parish Council have been in contact with HCC requesting signposts pointing out dog owners responsibilities which are enforceable, subject to an £80 fine if caught which could rise to £1250 if not paid.



On a more positive note, one of HCC's Rangers has contacted CPRE to see if they would be interested in repeating their community litter pick which reduced the problem last year. It looks like they have agreed to get involved again and will potentially be doing litter picks on a 4-to-6-week basis. This, in addition to HCC's own litter picking with staff and volunteers, will hopefully make an impact.

In addition, HCC Countryside Service is developing a number of initiatives around dog ownership and behaviour change, these include new codes of conduct, information, publicity, and signage as well as the creation of new Local Engagement Advocates for Dogs (LEADs) which will mean members of the Countryside Staff being trained to become specialists in finding solutions to site specific dog issues.

REMINDER - Aluminium recycling bin



There is a well labelled black bin next to the side gate at **20 Woodman Close**. Please collect, **clean** and deposit aluminium cans (drinks cans squashed please) aluminium foil (scrunched into tennis ball sized lumps or larger) or any old electric cables (chargers, extension leads, strings of fairy lights).

Items deposited will be sorted, weighed and recycled with all proceeds going to Hampshire and IOW Air Ambulance charity.

Update from Winchester City Councillor

Draft Local Plan

We have been given the first indication of submissions received during the public consultation on the **draft Local Plan**, which will determine where new development will go over the next 20 years. Over 3400 written responses have been received, which are currently being analysed. While we have been given very little new information, two items stood out for us.

The first was the high number of objections to the allocation of new housing in South Wonston. We support these objections and hope that they will lead to a change in the next version.

The second relates to land around Micheldever Station. The landowner has started to challenge the City Council over the number of new homes that need to be allowed for. The Council has indicated that they have not yet finished their joint strategy with the Partnership for South Hampshire authorities such as Portsmouth, Southampton and Fareham councils for the allocation of additional housing. This strategy could lead to a significant number of new homes in the Winchester district, which could require a large site, such as the land offered around Micheldever to be allocated. We have been raising objections for many months and will continue to do so. This issue was put to the recent meeting of Council and the Local Plan committee.

Community infrastructure projects.

Parish councils and community groups were invited to bid for **funding for community infrastructure projects.** The City Council is holding developer contributions that are there to reduce the impact of development. Bids for £10,000 to £200,000 could be submitted to wholly or partly fund projects that improve infrastructure for areas, such as walking, cycling, active travel, education, sport and leisure facilities, health and cultural facilities and other amenities. Initial bids had to be submitted by 31st March 2023.

Proposed Parking Plan for Woodman Close

The proposed **car parking plan** for Woodman Close will be discussed in a public meeting in early May.

Andover Road

A HCC Decision day held last week decided to support the current planning approval to close the **Andover Road** once Cala have built out the required number of homes, despite the 3,000 and 764 signature surveys received asking for the decision to be reversed.

Winchester Development Projects

There are several **development projects** coming to fruition in Winchester. A decision has been confirmed to appoint a new development partner for Central Winchester. We are in the standstill period before the company is announced.

The first round of dialogue has been held by Southampton University about the River Park site.

There has been a Station Approach decision to keep working up a plan given early positive consultation results although the nature of the railway commitment to the project is still unknown.

Work started on the new St Clements surgery this week which will be much appreciated by the 17,000 patients who have not had a modern surgery facility for some time.

Bus Subsidies

The Government have **extended the subsidy for bus companies**, so the £2 fare for single journeys on all buses will now continue until 30th June. We urge you to use the bus to save yourself some money, reduce traffic congestion and make a positive impact on the environment.

Photo ID needed for Voting in May Elections

REMEMBER: You will need **PHOTO ID** if you are voting in person at the local elections on Thursday 4th May 2023.

Update from Hampshire County Councillor

Budget:

Hampshire County Council's expenditure for 2023/24 includes a £2.6bn annual revenue budget and covers all the services delivered by the council for 1.4 million residents, including supporting its most vulnerable children and adults. Capital budget projects totaling £645.3m over the next three years include:

- £175m investment in new and extended school buildings to provide school places for children in Hampshire, giving a total of 18,874 new school places by September 2025.
- £142m for structural maintenance and improvement of roads and bridges.
- £103m of Integrated Transport Plan schemes including £58m of schemes focused on walking and cycling improvements.
- £0.3m funding towards the County Council's Flood Risk and Coastal Defence Programme as part of our response to the challenge of climate change.

Hampshire County Council's council tax precept for the financial year beginning 1 April 2023, will increase by a total of 4.99%, of which 2% will go specifically towards adults' social care, in line with Government policy. This equates to an annual charge of £1,460.25 for a Band D property – an increase of £69.45 per year or approximately £1.34 a week.

Coronation Grants

A new grant window for Hampshire County Councillors will open from 1st to 21st April. Called 'Member's Grants for the Coronation' will offer grants up to £1k to support local events. https://www.hants.gov.uk/community/grants/grants-list/county-councillor

England's Chief Medical Officer



Prof Sir Chris Whitty visited Hampshire this month to discuss work by the Hampshire Public Health team working alongside the NHS to help support a healthier old age. Preventing falls, being travel confident, better mental health and connecting through libraries will be part of the Live Longer Better programme launching soon.

Traffic Management

from 1st April 2023 the county council will take back traffic management and on-street parking functions from the District/Borough Councils. On street parking functions within the City of Winchester will revert to the county on 1st October and off-street parking will remain the responsibility of the District/Boroughs.

Increased police numbers announced

The Police and Crime Commissioner for Hampshire and Isle of Wight, Donna Jones, has presented her budget plan for the years 2023-24. She had previously pledged to increase police numbers by 600 and is on track to recruit these by the end of March. Her new budget has added an additional 50 officers to these numbers, to be funded through the police precept of council tax.

The Henry Beaufort School

In January the school performed Matilda Jnr The Musical at The Theatre Royal in Winchester, this production had been delayed due to covid but the wait was definitely worth it.

The event held over 3 nights was a delightful heart warming experience, with 50 children singing and acting with such enthusiasm and passion. The Winchester Magazine quoted "Steller performances throughout the cast". The Drama and Music Department and many other staff members worked very hard behind the scenes.

In January a group of Year 8 students at the school visited the Army Flying Museum with the Maths Department. They were greeted by staff from Leonardo Helicopters who talked about different types of engineering, their individual journeys to their chosen career paths, and were extremely knowledgeable about the range of helicopters their company builds. The students had the opportunity to explore the museum, including the various aircraft and equipment used in flight. Students constructed model paper helicopters and dropped them over a wind table to test their lift, resistance and balance, and adapted their designs to increase their flight length. A great day was had by all involved.

A group of Humanities Students visited Berlin at the start of half term. Miss Bruins (Subject Leader History) who led the trip said the city is a fantastic place to make links to their Geography, History and Religious Studies GCSEs as an Historic place and developing capital. Students visited the Sachsenhausen Memorial and Museum, a concentration camp used by the Nazi's from the 1930s to 1945. Here students considered its historical and ethical impact upon the world.

Students then went on to visit numerous parts of the Berlin wall, considering the impact of the war upon Berlin and Germany during the Cold War. There was also an opportunity for students to visit the Botanical Gardens to learn more about the plants and biome of the Rainforest as well as complete some Urban Geography looking at shopping habits along the Kurfurstendamm.

One of our students, G who takes Religious Studies at GCSE, had this to say, 'The Topography of Terror Museum really opened my eyes to the impact of the Nazi reign upon Berlin and Germany. The Botanical Gardens and the Futurism Museum we visited were really fun and it was just great to be in another country with my friends. The concentration camp we visited really helped me understand the different points of views of the perpetrators and what the victims of the crimes there experienced. I think everyone should visit there to get an understanding of this.'
