At the recent Annual Meeting of Hampshire Association of Local Councils (HALC), the Sparsholt Community Newsletter won the Best Local Council Newsletter competition and was praised for involving the community, being packed with relevant information as well as being colourful. Sparsholt Parish Council have been members of HALC for a long time and have found their advice and guidance especially valuable in the governance and operation of our parish council. To receive such recognition for the newsletter from the association is therefore particularly rewarding.

Village Support Group

The Sparsholt Village Newsletter came about during the early days of Covid Lockdown with the formation of a Village Support Group. The Support Group still operates on WhatsApp and has proven to be very useful to alert, help and inform in a timely fashion. Gridlock in Sparsholt

Sparsholt quickly becomes gridlocked when there are Highway issues on the M3 and A34. Residents have put forward several suggestions on the WhatsApp Support Group to deal with the gridlock and indeed excessive speed of some drivers. A small team of Parish Councillors will be meeting with our County Councillor, City Councillor and the Hampshire Highways Authority to determine what can and cannot be done to reduce the instances of gridlock, improve the flow of traffic, reduce the speed through the village and improve the safety of pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders without unduly impeding farm and emergency vehicles. The outcome of these discussions will be considered at future Parish Council meetings and reported in the newsletter.

Shop and Post Office

Christmas trees are available to order from now until 30th November, on behalf of the school and shop.

The shop is also running the Christmas Market on 10th December (same day as tree deliveries)

Finally - Beaujolais Nouveau Day is looming on 16th November. The shop still has a very limited number of bottles available for pre-order, or to buy on the day (subject to availability).

Sir John Moore Barracks - PLANS

The planned redevelopment of the site could have a significant impact on Sparsholt. We would recommend residents to attend and express their views at one of two events that have been planned:

- Friday 10th November from 3-7pm in Littleton Millennium Memorial Hall; and
- Saturday 11th November from 10.00am until 2pm at The Henry Beaufort school (the 2-minute silence being observed at 11.00am).

The Defence Infrastructure Organisation (DIO) has been exploring options for bringing forward proposals for new development at its Sir John Moore Barracks site, allocated within Winchester City Council's Draft Local Plan (Policy W2) to deliver significant residential led development of between 750-1,000 new homes.

Dear John and Parishioners of St. Stephen's

I would like to thank you for thinking of our residents this Harvest and donating so generously. Your donations have been carefully stored by our volunteers and will help us to feed our residents over the coming months, saving our charity much-needed money on our food bills. Also thank you for the generous donation of £60 for us to be able to buy fresh meat. As well as providing home-cooked meals for our residents, some of your donations will also be gifted in food parcels to those moving on from The Winchester Beacon to their own home.

We continue to accommodate and support 22 people every day and night of the year across our 4 properties. Last year, our residents stayed with us for an average of 111 nights. As well as being a safe place to stay, we help our residents to rebuild their lives and last year we delivered 288 hours of counselling and psychotherapy as part of their support out of homelessness.

Your donations will help people like Tim who came to stay with us after his relationship broke down with his mum. He stayed with us for 15 months before we supported him to move into his own flat. Before leaving, Tim reflected on his stay: "My time at The Beacon has definitely bolstered me".


Wondering if you're eligible? Key criteria includes:

We are also proud to have released our latest B Corp Impact Statement in recent weeks which is now available to read on the website. Customers who visit us regularly will be aware of our status as an accredited B Corp, a recognition acquired in 2021 when we joined a community of like-minded businesses in a global movement of using business as a force for good. The accreditation was recognition for the 40+ years of work by our owner's family to invest in people, develop a reputation for welcoming service levels and for being conscientious about how we run our business.



We are the first hotel group in the UK to be certified as B Corp and have been putting this status to good use at Lainston House. As well as proactive steps towards reducing our reliance on fossil fuels, sourcing suppliers locally and ensuring that the welfare and conditions of our staff is market leading, we have taken on a few new initiatives that local residents might notice when visiting the estate. Recently, all of our signage

has been replaced with new, ethically and sustainably sourced and produced wood. The aim is long term, attractive and more modern signage which has a minimal impact on the environment.

We have also planted 850+ trees this year in a new area of orchard near the kitchen garden and woodland on the northern activity field in a further move towards carbon neutrality – the trees include a wide range of native broadleaf varieties which also happen to mirror the names of our hotel bedrooms!





Furthermore, we are investing across all of our estates, eliminating fossil fuel reliant kit and equipment, prioritising estate management, investing in our people and accommodation and ensuring that our guests, staff and suppliers are involved in the journey.

At Lainston we have invested in a rocket composter, an eyecatching industrial piece of machinery designed to all but eliminate food waste from our kitchens and generate the required amount of compost in a fraction of the normal time, very useful for our extensive gardens. The rocket will be located in our Kitchen Garden and will be available to see during our Kitchen Garden Tours from early 2024.

Each department has many examples of how we are responding to the challenge of becoming a sustainable business for good and we welcome the opportunity to show these initiatives and many others to our customers on a regular basis.



For example, did you know that in September we harvested over 700kg of apples from our 20 varieties of trees on site to produce more than 320l of organic, apple juice for our guests?! It tastes spectacular, please come by and try some if you get the chance.

We love this time of year at the hotel and are excited welcome to guests from the local area and beyond.

The school has returned for the new academic year after saying goodbye to our students who sat their exams in May and June. Miss Hearle (Headteacher) commented on the results on the day they were released in August.

"The Henry Beaufort School is celebrating excellent results that are in line with expected outcomes and as we anticipated, a significant number of subjects have results that are above the grades published in 2019.

Maths and English continue what is now a five-year trend of above 80% for grades 4-9.

The school is committed to a broad and balanced range of GCSE choices, and it is particularly satisfying to see expressive arts subjects such Music and Photography at 90% grade 4 to 9. Equally the school's focus on languages has seen another set of outstanding results with French and Spanish at 91% and 85% respectively.

Despite lost learning time in lockdown, our young people have risen to the challenge and worked with my incredible, highly skilled colleagues to secure successful future opportunities in education and the workplace.

We look forward to welcoming these students back to the school in November for their certificate Presentation Evening.


