#### Renewable Energy at Sparsholt College

Ecotricity has resubmitted its planning application for an Anaerobic Digester and Education Building at Sparsholt College. Details can be found on the planning pages of Winchester City Council website <a href="http://planningapps.winchester.gov.uk/online-applications/">http://planningapps.winchester.gov.uk/online-applications/</a> reference number 16/01679/FUL. The latest date for your comments is Thursday 18 August. The Parish Council hopes to arrange a further meeting for the residents of Sparsholt and surrounding parishes in the near future.

## **Village Shop and Post Office**

The shop will be moving to summer holiday opening hours from 25 July to 2 September. During this period the shop will be open from 8am to 2pm Mondays to Fridays and then open from 8am to 12pm Saturdays. The Post Office will be open 9am to 12pm Mondays to Fridays only. Both the shop and Post Office are closed on bank holidays

#### **Mobile Libraries**

In order to inform the Library Service Strategy to 2020 the County Council undertook an eleven-week public consultation exercise with more than 250 local parish and town councils; over 150,000 library customers and 40,000 social media followers. In addition, the Library Team undertook eight roadshows and conducted 603 telephone surveys. The mobile library service [MLS] is provided by 5 vehicles, all nearing the end of their ten year leases. The MLS cost £360,000 a year to run but is only used by around 2,230 people – less than 1% of Hampshire's library customers and 0.1% of Hampshire residents. Over a quarter of MLS customers also have access to a static library. Nearly 2,000 people made over 4,000 different comments but, in summary, 62% of respondents agreed with the proposed closure of the MLD and 75% of residents who took part in the telephone survey also agreed.

No static libraries will close but as from the end of June 2016 the mobile library service will be replaced by a Home Library Service, delivered by volunteers for those customers who are unable to access a static library. If you can't get to a library because of ill-health, disability or caring responsibilities, then the Home Library Service will come to you!
