ELLIOT THE DRAGON PATCHER

Congratulations to Cllr Wooles who recently won a competition to name one of Hampshire County Council's brand-new Dragon Patchers purchased to help repair the county's roads, damaged by the winter weather. The machinery is nicknamed the 'Dragon' because it expels flames to de-ice and dry out the road surface. It is then cleaned with compressed air and sealed with a stone mix and hot bitumen emulsion. With the surface repair completed in as little as two minutes, the Patcher can move on to the next repair.

It is hoped that Elliot the Dragon Patcher will visit Sparsholt very soon.

PARISH PLAN UPDATE - ROAD SAFETY

The new larger and clearer HGV advisory signs have now been installed by Winchester City Council on the approaches to the village.

If you witness a road safety incident for example vehicles driving at speed, HGVs that have no legitimate business in the village causing obstruction, vehicles driving too close to pedestrians please do report this to the Parish Clerk (<u>clerk@sparsholtparish.org</u>). Please record as much detail as possible including date and time and if possible, vehicle registration, company names on vehicles and photographs. This information will be used to build a dossier of evidence to present to Hampshire County Council to raise the profile of road safety as a major issue in Sparsholt.

Winchester City Council is collating and reviewing the information from the various surveys that have taken place to date at the site identified at Woodman Close. It is anticipated that the next round of public consultation will take place after the school summer holidays.

BUS PASSES

The older person's bus pass entitles you to free travel on bus services throughout England from 9:30am to 11pm Monday to Friday and all day at weekends and on public holidays. To find out if you are eligible and how to apply for and renew an older person's 'blue stripe' bus pass visit https://www.hants.gov.uk/transport/trafficandtravel/publictransport/buspasses/olderpersonsbuspass.

Not only does the use of a free bus pass mean no parking charges for your journey but is an opportunity to help reduce CO2 emissions and protect a rural bus service.

POLITE REMINDER

The Dog Walking Code https://www.hants.gov.uk/thingstodo/countryside/dogwalking#step-0 supported by the Countryside Service reminds owners to:

- Keep your dog with you on paths or access land and don't let it stray into crops including fields of grass, fruit and vegetables
- Never let your dog worry or chase wildlife or livestock.
