PARISH PLAN UPDATE - ROAD SAFETY

Cllrs Wooles and Wood met with Cllr Humby, Executive Member for Economy, Transport and Environment and Deputy Leader of Hampshire County Council, following Elliot's visit in the summer. The County Council made a policy decision in 2016 to prioritise its limited resources to reducing the numbers of people killed and injured on Hampshire's roads by identifying where collisions resulting in injury are occurring and implementing specific casualty reduction measures at these locations. Hampshire County Council does not fund measures if it establishes collisions resulting in injury are not occurring. Cllr Humby has advised that the County Council's data shows there to be no treatable accident patterns in Sparsholt.

If you do witness a road safety incident for example vehicles driving at speed, HGVs that have no legitimate business in the village, causing obstruction and/or damage, vehicles driving too close to pedestrians, etc please report this to the Parish Clerk (clerk@sparsholtparish.org). Any information such as, date and time, vehicle registration, company names on vehicles, photographs, etc will be helpful.

The gathering of this type of information is a critical part of building a dossier of evidence to present to Hampshire County Council in support of our case for enhanced traffic management measures in the parish.

The Parish Council is investigating community lead initiatives supported by Hampshire County Council. As part of this work, we are progressing the possible introduction of Speed Limit Reminder Signs. The School has introduced a staggered drop off in the morning in an effort to reduce congestion.

Clearing leaves

Please take care when using leaf blowers. Piles of leaves blown onto the Highway create a hazard that can cause serious road accidents and/or injury to pedestrians.

Parking

Please avoid parking vehicles on pavements and verges as pedestrians are then at risk of an accident by walking on the road. Verges in the village are being badly damaged by inconsiderate parking.
