New Book for sale in the Shop:

History of Sparsholt College

A Place of Transformation, The history of Sparsholt College, Hampshire, from 1899, written by John Lander, a Sparsholt College governor, has just been published.




While the College has been located on the edge of the village from 1914, soon after Hampshire County Council bought 251 acres of Westley Farm, its links with the local community started before then.

Different generations of the Twentyman family came from Cumberland to farm Westley Farm from the 1890s until 1914 and, until much later, Moor Court Farm, and they made themselves very much part of the local community. Village residents provided accommodation for female students in the very early days, an English cricket captain might have had a link with Sparsholt's cricket club, an unsuccessful attempt was made to buy Moor Court Farm, and one longstanding member of Sparsholt College's staff, and his wife, gave unstinted service to the village community.

These are just examples of the close relationship between the College and the village that are recorded in the book.

The school's Samba band started the event which led the procession of the children with banners, and this was followed by readings based on the school's motto Pride, Happiness, and Ambition. The Bishop of Basingstoke David Williams gave an inspiring sermon and wished the school well for the next 50 years.

It was a wonderful evening for all the students and parents who attended.

The school celebrated the student success in GSCE's in August. The school is delighted to announce that we have maintained our consistently high academic outcomes. 32% of all grades achieved were grade 7-9. In the core subjects Maths (83% of students attained a grade 4 or above), English Language 84%, English Literature 83%, and Science 80% (Biology 97%, Chemistry 95%, and Physics 94%.

Miss Hearle, Headteacher stated "This has been a hard-won success story for our students, and we are so proud of not only what they have achieved but how they have worked to achieve these superb results.

"Well done Year 11, you are superb role models for us all. "

We look forward with great expectations to our 51st year in providing inclusive secondary education.

Hedgerows – time to trim back

Following the recent rain hedgerows have been putting on quite a lot of growth. In the interests of pedestrian safety, can you please make sure that any hedges that you are responsible for that border public footpaths and/or roads are trimmed back.

HAM GREEN

Many thanks to Howard Annesley for rebuilding (with a little help from me) the cycle barrier at the Dean end of the footpath and also for extending the barrier at The Green today. Photos attached. Thank you also to Farmer Oz for carting our equipment down the field to the Dean end in his machine and also to Mark for supplying the no-cycling badges which you can see have been fitted to the barriers in a prominent position.



Roy Broadhead and I fitted metal mesh tree guards to 8 of the 15 new trees planted last year which will provide long lasting protection against animal damage. Unfortunately, the special pliers supplied to clip the sides of the guards together were faulty so we will have to return later in the month to complete the job. Apologies, forgot to take a photo.

Work Programme

Saturday 5th November 2022

Trim and top cut hedges (Butterfly and New Hedge Areas). Clear residual weeds.

Hack out ground level stumps around the new sweet chestnut tree behind bench in Picnic area. Clear growth around the beech tree and cut back the encroaching tree on corner of Picnic area.

Check and repair rustic benches and log pile habitats.

Trim sides of upper footpath.

Ring and remove ivy in chosen areas. Burn stored brash.

Saturday 3rd December 2022

Cut back growth along the hedge on side of the Car Park.

Clear around the deadwood bench and hedge for clear view by leaning tree on the lower footpath.

Coppice old Hazel selectively along the lower footpath; stack ready for fencing & burning.

New Hedge area: reduce some tree branches for more light and clear around the spindle trees. Ring and remove ivy in chosen areas.

Sunday 8th January 2023

Carry out any necessary work in the area across the road from the car park along Burrow Road. Collect brash for dead hedging or burning.

Continue to ring and remove ivy in chosen areas.

Annual Volunteers get-together at Memorial Hall - TBC

Saturday 4th February 2023

Check all new hedges, clear bases and weed. Remove small Sycamores.

Clear the area behind Ham Green Cottage, as needed.

Check and reinstate posts that mark the key points on the information leaflet for HG Common.

Tasks to be decided. Last bonfire.


